

Honors Accelerated Pre-Calculus 494/495 Classroom Guidelines Ms. Davis



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Course Description

Honors Pre-Calculus 94 and 95 include the study of trigonometric, inverse, linear, quadratic, polynomial, and rational function and their graphs. Additional topics of study are complex numbers, conic sections and limits, and an introduction to differential calculus. The purpose of this course is to prepare students for AP Calculus BC and/or a mathematics major college calculus course.

Grading Policy

Grades are calculated by percentages of two main categories: Assessments and Classwork.

90% of a student's grade is determined by assessments (quizzes and tests). 10% of a student's grade is determined by homework, in class completion, HW checks, and daily assignments. Grades can be accessed on Infinite Campus.

Final Exam

The final exam is worth 15% of the overall grade at the end of the semester.

Absences

Students that attend a field trip or are home sick are expected to keep up with the daily videos and need to also be completing/attempting the assigned classwork for each day. This is to allow students the opportunity to ask questions upon their return as opposed to being swamped with multiple days worth of HW and video notes.

- If you have a planned absence (i.e. a vacation, field trip, etc), it is your responsibility to notify your instructor at least a day in advance to schedule your make-up work. If you do not inform the instructor, you will get NO MAKE-UP PRIVILEGES.
- If you have excused, unplanned absences (i.e. sickness), you are responsible to pick up and make up any work missed. As a general rule for excused absences, you will be given one day to make up work for each day you've missed.
- If you miss the day of a test, you are expected to take the test on THE DAY OF YOUR RETURN. If you miss the day of review before a test, you will still take the test ON THE SCHEDULED DAY. You will get no breaks here since you are given a calendar in advance. Tests and quizzes will be made up during class time unless another time has been prearranged with the teacher.

Cheating

Any individual caught cheating will receive a ZERO for that test, quiz, or assignment. Cheating is defined as either giving or receiving help of any sort when it is not appropriate to do so.
